"VAMOS A LA PLAYA!" – Holidays in the times of Franco A project by Monika Anselment

We are developing a project under the theme of this title. The project will be developed for both institutions, the Museu de l'Empordà, Figueres, and Bòlit, Centre d'Art Contemporani. Girona. All media are accepted, including 2- and 3- dimensional works, video, sound, performance and conferences. In this first phase, we are looking for artists who spent their holidays in Spain during the Franco regime and who are interested in proposing artistic ideas about their experiences during this time. In the second phase of the project, the selected artists are asked to discuss their proposal with the institution.

The final selection and execution of the project is subject to the outcome of the submitted proposals. The selection committee reserves the right to terminate the project altogether if no projects seem suitable to the proposed theme. We thank you for your understanding.

The project is scheduled for the 2nd quarter of 2024 or the first quarter of 2025. The budget is not yet closed, but artist fees will be included.

Description:

The last victim of the Franco dictatorship was Salvador Puig Antich in 1974. At the same time an image of Spain was created and spread around that painted Spain as an ideal holiday destination for international tourism.

Although the development of tourism in Spain had already begun at the end of the 19th century, it began to proliferate in the 1960's as in all northern Mediterranean countries. One of the main reasons for promoting Spain as a holiday destination was to boost the Spanish economy. The Franco regime, winner of the Spanish Civil War (1936 – 1939), promoted a homogeneous image of the country collapsing it to a uniform folklore, and denying the diversity of the various regions. The tourists acted as ambassadors raising the image of Spain as a forthcoming country, contributing to the perception of normality under Franco's dictatorship. We could even say that the tourists generated a parallel world to the one that the people of the country who were not related to the regime and its principles lived and suffered.

Was there, however, after all, the possibility of perceiving the dictatorship as a dictatorship? How is this perception reflected in the works of the artists who spent the holidays with their families in Spain? How did the artists perceive the dictatorship and its repercussions in the day-to-day lives of the people they came into contact with or on their own holidays?

We want to curate a project that aims to draw attention to this controversial issue. We are looking for artists, who summered in Spain and want to share their understanding, memory and reflection of their experience of the country under Franco.
